Throughout the year, leaders will convene four times, in October, December, February and May. Relay faculty visit schools periodically to walk the school with the principal manager and principal to support the principal in implementing their learning, look for trends in instruction and provide coaching and feedback. A baseline assessment is conducted at the beginning of the program and again at the end
