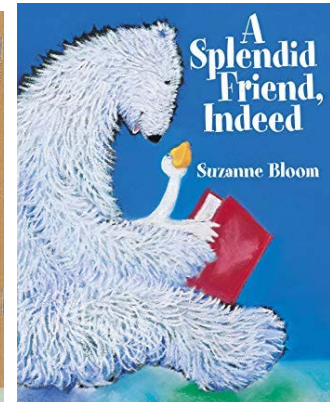
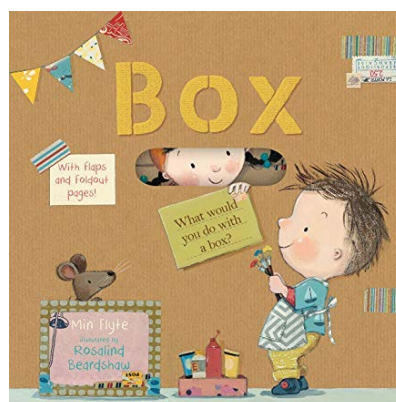
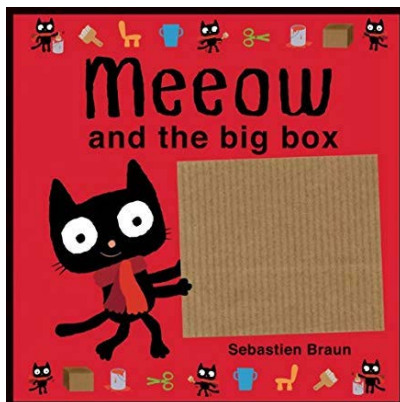
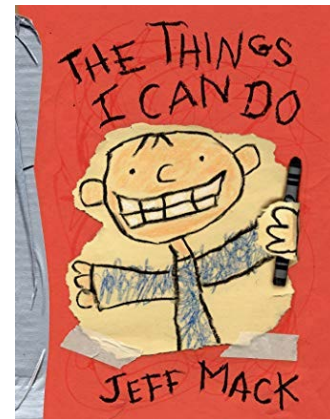
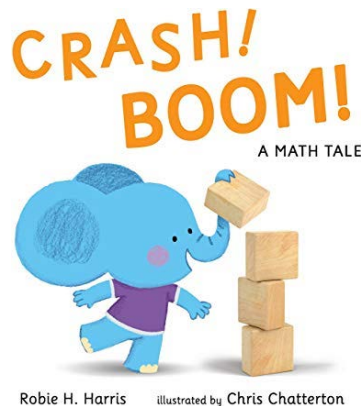
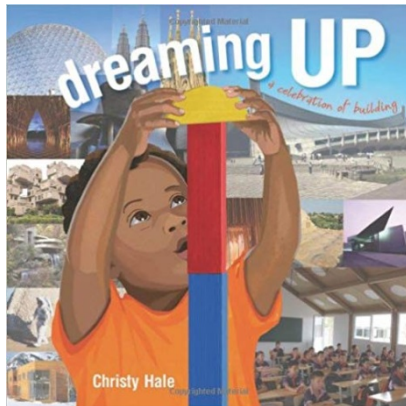
There are many great books to read during a storytime or other event along with Penguinaut!
