

Registered Behavior Technician Course(RBT)™

Training sessions offered twice a year: January- June & July- December

Overview

This 40+ hour readiness training is a **free**, self-directed, online training that provides content on evidence based behavior techniques and strategies.

Participants who might be interested include: School psychologists, social workers, counselors, speech-language pathologists, occupational therapists, special educators, support staff, and parents.

This course fulfills the Behavior Analyst Certification Board's (BACB) eligibility training requirements toward attaining a Registered Behavior Technician[™] (RBT[™]) credential. An RBT is a paraprofessional, teacher or practitioner who practices under the close, ongoing supervision of a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) or Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA). The RBT is primarily responsible for the direct implementation of behavior-analytic services, but does not design intervention or assessment plans. The curriculum will fulfill the BACB RBT Task List standards.

This course <u>does NOT include the supervision and exam portions</u> of the BACB RBT requirements. The course is offered independent of the BACB.

While you are enrolled in the course, you may contact the instructors with your questions. Instructors will reply within two business days. Upon completion of the course, students will receive a certificate of completion. This certificate can be shared with the Behavior Analyst Certification Board if they are pursuing an RBT credential.

APPLICATIONS will be open one month prior to the session start date.

Spots are limited and will be filled on a first come first serve basis, as well as by an application review. There will be no waitlist for this course. You will be notified once your application is reviewed and accepted.
