Standards Revision Update

The revision committees for Visual and Performing Arts met the week of October 4, 2021 to develop a first draft of standards revision recommendations. The drafts will be presented to the State Board during the November meeting, as well as being available for public feedback November 12, 2021 through January 1, 2022.
