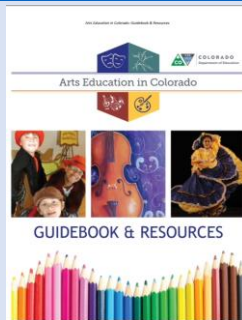

2022 Arts Standards Family and Community Guides

To support families, communities, and teachers in realizing the goals of the new 2022 Colorado Academic Standards (CAS), the Family and Community Guide was developed to provide overviews of the learning expectations for preschool through high school. Arts Education for Workforce Development Act HB 10-1273

In April of 2010 the Colorado Senate voted 23-12 to pass House Bill 10-1273, an arts in the schools measure which clarifies and defines Visual and Performing Arts as stand-alone, core subjects in Pk-12 schools. The bill encourages districts to provide courses in the arts which help build a solid academic foundation, reduce school dropout rates, and enable students to stay competitive in the local and global economy through innovation and the creative skills that are learned when participating in the arts. 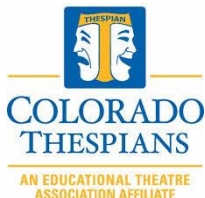


Shadow Day November 7, 2022, from 8:30am-3:45pm
