## News from the Office of Standards and Instructional Support

The Office of Standards and Instructional Support (SIS) has developed 17 Professional Learning Modules to build the <u>standards literacy</u> of our educators and leaders, as well as support your understanding of the revisions to and instructional implications within the 2020 Colorado Academic Standards (CAS).

The 17 <u>Professional Learning Modules</u> are divided into three phases.



- 1. **Phase 1: Standards**. Within this group of modules educators and leaders will:
  - Establish a foundation in disciplinary and standards literacy;
  - Understand the historical perspective in the development of and revision to CAS;
  - Identify the differences between the 2009/2010 CAS and the 2020 CAS.
- 2. **Phase 2: Curriculum**. This group of modules includes topics on curriculum and resource alignment to the 2020 CAS. Educators and leaders will:
  - Interpret and map the 2020 CAS to current curriculum;
  - Perform a gap analysis of current curriculum;
  - Create a plan to fill gaps and address overlaps within curriculum.
- 3. **Phase 3: Instruction**. The final phase of modules incorporates mapping instructional strategies to the innovations within the standards for Best, First Instruction. Educators and leaders will:
  - Define best, first instruction and attain a repertoire of high impact instructional strategies.

With implementation of the 2020 CAS vastly approaching, we encourage you to walk through each module.
