Anticipated Year of Graduation (AYG) Flags)

NOTE: This field is not the final value. CDE runs must run an anticipated year of graduation reconciliation process once all districts have submitted their data and the collection is finalized. Districts have the opportunity to review impacted records as part of the Post-Cross LEA phase. The final value is determined upon completion of this process and finalization of the SEY snapshot in December. will be determined when this process is run in late December.

AYG-related internal flags

There are 4 AYG-related internal flags that are set for every record. They are as follows:

- Starting Year for Graduation Cohort The school year (represented by Spring semester) that the student was placed into a graduation cohort.
- Starting Grade for Graduation Cohort The grade attended when the student was placed into a graduation cohort.
- Anticipated Year of Graduation The year the student is expected to graduate high school for 'on time' graduation represented by the 4-digit Spring semester.
- Starting District for Graduation Cohort The 4-digit district code of the district attended when the student was placed into a graduation cohort.

Automated Process Questions

A student's Anticipated Year of Graduation (AYG) is automatically assigned during the Student End of Year data collection process. Once a student is assigned an AYG, they remain in that AYG throughout their high school career even if they experience a grade reassignment or retention. This automated process works through the following questions:

- 1. Does the student already have an AYG cohort assigned from a prior reporting year?
 - If so, fill in the AYG cohort information for this student based upon this information.
 - Note: This includes students with an AYG cohort assignment from any Colorado district, not just the district the student currently attends.
- 2. Should the student remain without an AYG assignment for this year?
 - Preschool through 8th grade students without an AYG assignment should not be assigned an AYG during the current school year.
- 3. Should the student be assigned an AYG cohort this year?
 - If the student is in 9th grade or above as of October 1st of the current school year, an AYG will be assigned to those who do not already have an AYG cohort assignment.
 - Note: AYG cohorts are represented by the year of the Spring semester of the anticipated school year of graduation. So, an AYG of 2022 means the student is anticipated to graduate in the 2021-2022 school year.

AYG Flag Logic

AYG Cohort assigned in a prior year:

If a student was assigned an AYG in a prior school year from any district, they will remain in that same AYG throughout their remaining high school career. When a snapshot is created the data pipeline system will internally look for a prior AYG assignment for the given SASID from the historical Student End of Year data. If an AYG is found for the given SASID, the data fields listed above will be brought into the current year snapshot.

Assign to a Cohort:

If no prior AYG data was found for the given SASID, the system will then check if an AYG should be assigned using the following criteria.

- Student is in 9th grade or above and doesn't already have an assigned AYG
- School code is not from a detention center (9801-8009)
- Student's exit date is 00000000 or is on/after October 1st of the current year

 - See the Student School Association file layout on the Student Interchange webpage for descriptions of exit codes.

Students who meet the above criteria will have their AYG set along with the supporting data fields. Please note that the record with the earliest school exit date on or after October 1st will be used to set a student's AYG Cohort.

- Starting Year for Graduation Cohort = set to current reporting year
- Starting Grade for Graduation Cohort = set to current reported grade.
- Starting District for Graduation Cohort = set to the current reported district.
 - o Mismatches between districts are reconciled during the Post Cross LEA phase of the SEY collection.
- Anticipated Year of Graduation = set based upon the following calculation

Not Yet in a Cohort:

Students without a prior AYG assignment who are below 9th grade or have an school exit date prior to October 1st (excluding those with school exit types ed 01, 18, 19, 20, 21, 26, 30, 40, 50, or 70) will not have an AYG set at this time. Their AYG data field and supporting data fields will be set to the following pattern.

- Starting Year for Graduation Cohort = 0000
- Starting Grade for Graduation Cohort = 000
- Anticipated Year of Graduation = 0000
- Starting District for Graduation Cohort = 0000

AYG Reconciliation

If a student is reported in multiple school districts in the current year and is entering 9th grade or above for the first time in the current year, an AYG reconciliation may take place once all districts have submitted their data. The final value determined in this process is based upon the student's highest reported grade on or after October 1st.

Example:

• District A reports student in 10th grade with an school exit date on/after October 1st

In this example, the student's AYG will be set based upon the District A's reported grade level of 10th grade, setting the AYG to current year + 2.

Instructional Program Service Type (IPST) Cohort Fields

Instructional Program Services Type cohort fields are set to '1' (yes) based upon a student's status for the subgroup in the current collection and in prior collections. These cohorts are utilized for calculating graduation rates for the IPST cohort. If a student with an assigned AYG (grades 9-12) belongs to one of the subgroups below at any point during their high school career they remain part of the subgroup, even if they are not an active member of the subgroup in the current year. For example, a student will be included in the English Learner IPST Cohort if they were an English Learner in their 9th grade year even if they transition out of an EL program and were considered a former English Learner later in their high school career.

- Economically Disadvantaged Student reported as free lunch or reduced-price lunch eligible (FRL = '01' or '02') at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Gifted and Talented Student reported as gifted and talented ('9') at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Homeless Student reported as homeless ('3' or '4') at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Migrant Student reported as migrant ('1') at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Title I Student reported as Title I ('2' or '3') at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Postsecondary Program Student reported as retained to participate in a postsecondary program such as ASCENT/PTECH/TREP (retention code '2') as a 12th grader
- English Learner Student reported as an English Learner (NEP, LEP, FEP M1, FEP M2) at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Student with a Disability Student reported as special education student ('1') at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Military Connected Student reported as military connected ('1') at some point during 9th-12th grade
- Foster Student reported as foster ('1') at some point during 9th-12th grade

Technical Steps:

Check IPST Cohort in Prior Year:

If an IPST Cohort field was '1' (yes) in the prior year collection, set this value to '1' in the current collection.

Check IPST Cohort Membership in Current Year:

If student's current year status indicates membership in the cohort, set this value to '1'.

No IPST Cohort Membership:

If the student was not a member of the IPST Cohort in a prior year or the current year, leave this value set to '0' (no).

Instructional Program Service Type (IPST) Yearly Flags

Instructional Program Services Type yearly fields are set to '1' (yes) based upon a student's status for the subgroup in the current. IPST Yearly values are an annual value used for calculating dropout, mobility, and stability rates for the IPST cohort. Note: Dropout, mobility, stability rates use the annual status of a student when determining IPST membership. Not all IPST subgroups use separate 'Yearly' IPST flags and are determined based on the other relevant data fields.
