McKinney-Vento: Things to know

2017-2018: School districts within Colorado enrolled and served **24,505** students under McKinney-Vento

This includes: 1,529 were 5 and under (not K) 2,363 Unaccompanied Youth

The US Department of Education released *Early Childhood Homelessness State Profiles 2018*. You can find it <u>here</u>

In Colorado: 1 in 18 children under the age of 6 are experiencing homelessness

11% of children under age 6 who were experiencing homelessness were served by Head Start/Early Head Start or McKinney- Vento funded ECE programs (2016)

** Don't forget to track and keep a record of birth-2 and 3-5 (not K) for USDE reporting.

Point-In-Time Count and School District Participation
