Educational Stability Grant Released

Educational Stability Request for Grant Award Application Now Available

The intent of the Educational Stability Grant is to address reducing educational barriers for students who experience high mobility by providing academic and social-emotional services and supports to highly mobile students. The purpose of this funding opportunity is to support the removal of all educational barriers children and youth experiencing high mobility with an emphasis on improving school attendance, reducing behavioral and discipline incidents, increasing grade-level promotion, reducing dropout rate, and increasing graduation and completion rates.

Approximately \$900,000 is available for the 2019-2020 school year. Based on available funding, established need and quality of the proposal, three-year grants will be awarded, ranging from approximately \$70,000 to \$90,000 per year for LEAs, BOCES, or Approved Facility Schools.
