The courses are designed to produce a certificate after you have completed the post assessment (pass with 80% with 2 tries). The post assessment will show as a notification in several places within in the user record. You will be prompted each time you log in as well.

After you have successfully completed this training, print the certificate and present to your school nurse within 30 days. You will then need to complete a skills portion and receive delegation. In Colorado, **this online training alone does not allow you to administer routine medications in the school setting.** You must demonstrate competency to administer medications to the school nurse, who delegates the task of medication administration.
