ASCENT 12+1

(Accelerating Students through Concurrent ENrollmenT)

ASCENT 12+1 is Concurrent Enrollment extended into a 5th year, providing graduating seniors tuition assistance with one extra year of free college level coursework.

** All ASCENT applicants should also complete their FAFSA and apply to their program/colleges of choice.

If students qualify for financial aid from their program/schools of choice that exceeds ASCENT tuition, students should accept financial aid, which might include textbooks, and forfeit their ASCENT slots to students on the ASCENT waitlist.

• Student Eligibility

- o On track to graduate at end of 12th grade year (meets HS grad requirements)
- o Must have 12 transcripted college level credits (100 level+) by graduation
 - Includes articulated CTE college credits and AP tests scores of 3-5
 - Does not include remedial courses credits, IB, or CLEP
- o Selected by HS Principal or Counselor
- o Must have an updated Pathway Plan (ICAP)
- o Must select a postsecondary degree or certification program
- o Satisfy minimum college prerequisites for ASCENT courses (no remedial courses)
- Must not be in need of remediation coursework for their selected pathway
- o Retained 5th year seniors do not qualify
- o No prior ASCENT participation (1year limit)
- College Readiness Scores (no remedial courses in ASCENT)

- ASCENT Courses must align with Pathway Plan & apply to degree/certificate completion
- Tuition Re-payment expected for final grades of D, F, or course withdrawals
- **Diplomas and Transcripts** awarded at *end* of ASCENT year and dated the *end* of ASCENT year; students can attend graduation exercises with their class; ASCENT grades are included in HS GPA.
- Attendance Form must be turned in for one course each semester. (Attendance forms from HS Counselor)

ASCENT Funding

- Pays College Tuition at Community College rate
 - ➤ Full-time (FT) = 12+ college credits
 - ➤ Part-time (PT) = 3-11 college credits
- FAFSA All ASCENT applicants should still submit their FAFSA and apply to colleges
 (If student receives financial aid which exceeds ASCENT funding, student should accept financial aid and decline ASCENT slot)

ASCENT Slots

- \circ 1 FT student (12+ cr) = 1.0 slot
- o 1 PT student (3-11 cr) = 0.5 slot
- o 1 PT student + 1 PT student = 1.0 slot

• ASCENT Timeline

- o Jan 15 Estimate Number of ASCENT Slot Requests to CE Director
- o Apr 15 Confirm Student List to CE Director
- o June 1 CDE Notification of Slot Allocations to Districts (typically by late May)
