Colorado Academic Standards Revision and Capturing the Parent Voice - Karol Gates, Director of Standards and Instructional Support, CDE

- By state law, standards must be reviewed and revised every six years.
- Not related to Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) State Plan development process.
- Must be comparable in scope, relevance and rigor to the highest national and international standards.
- Standards review and revision process must be focused on the substance or content of the standards themselves.
- Standards team wants to capture the parent voice this year.
- Two key elements of standards content and skills.
- SACPIE suggested revisions to the materials which will be presented to parents and parent groups.
