Selection process: CDE identifies the top 10 percent of Colorado's school districts with the highest performance on the district performance framework **Timeline:** Districts who receive the distinction will be notified in Nov. 2013

The Green Ribbon honors schools or districts for their efforts to improve student health and achievement, and reduce their environmental impact. **Award:** Federal recognition award and national award ceremony **Selection process:** Competitive application process through CDE which submits Colorado nominees to the U.S. Department of Education **Nominations open:** Fall 2013 **Nominations due:** December 2013

Blue Ribbon - <u>www.cde.state.co.us/cdeawards/BlueRibbon/blueribbon.htm</u> The Blue Ribbon honors highly successful schools for:

- Exemplary high performing (top 10 percent measured by state tests in reading and math) **OR**
- Exemplary improving (at least 40 percent of students from disadvantaged background and dramatically improved student performance to high levels in reading and math on state assessments).

Award: Each school is given a banner and statuette, and the principal and one teacher from each school are invited to a special ceremony in Washington, D.C. Selection process: CDE identifies eligible schools and submits identified schools' applications to the U.S. Department of Education Nominations due: February 2013

Centers of Excellence - <u>www.cde.state.co.us/cdeawards/ctrsofexcellence.htm</u> Each year, public schools are recognized that enroll a 75 percent at-risk student population and demonstrate the highest rates of student longitudinal growth, as measured by the Colorado Growth Model.

Award: Winning schools receive a certificate and are recognized at a CDE awards ceremony in Dec. 2013

Selection process: CDE identifies schools with top growth on TCAP with a student population that is 75 percent at-risk

Timeline: Winners are notified in Nov. 2013

Two Title I Schools are recognized annually:

- One school is recognized with the Exemplary Achievement Award (school with the highest number of students partially proficient, proficient or advanced on aggregate TCAP scores for all grades served)

Selection process: States coordinate selection process of five finalists from each discipline using NSF criteria and the national selection committee chooses winners from each state
