Executive Summary

SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES IN COLORADO (2010-2011 ACADEMIC YEAR)

Supplemental Educational Services (SES) is one component of Title I, Part A of the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) passed by Congress in 2001. This program provides tutoring services provided to eligible students at no expense to the students enrolled in schools that are in their second year of school improvement or that are on Corrective Action or Restructuring. The district pays for the services out of its Title I, Part A funds set aside specifically for this service. The Colorado Department of Education (CDE) performs a critical role in the administration of the program by a) approving vendors to provide tutoring services, b) evaluating the effectiveness of vendors improving student outcomes, and c) removing any providers that fail to increase the academic achievement of students for two consecutive years. This executive summary details findings from the Vendor Effectiveness Report and the Statewide Effectiveness Report.

DESCRIPTION OF SES PROGRAM PARTICIPATION

The SES program served 7,986 students during the 2010-2011 academic year. The number of participants declined slightly from the 2009-2010 academic year (n = 8,139), but still reflects a marked increase from participation between 2006 and 2009, when the number of students served ranged from 3,869 to 4,857. Students served were enrolled in kindergarten through 10^{th} grade.

Demographic data were available for 98% of students who received services. The SES program reached a diverse population of students that included a high percentage of Latino students and students whose first language is not English. In general, the population of students served was:

- 75.44% Hispanic (n = 5,979)
- 49.92% male (n = 3,956)
- 82.50% enrolled in 1st through 5th grade
- 33.88% English only speakers (2,685) and
- 59.95% not fully proficient in English (NEP or LEP).

Evaluation of the program has been ongoing since the 2006 - 2007 academic year. The multi-year evaluation enables an examination of student participation across successive years. Of the students served through SES during the 2010 - 2011 academic year,

- 69.57% participated for the first time in 2010 2011, but
- 704 students have received services for 3 or more years since program inception.

Hours of tutoring ranged from 0.25 to 126.00, with a median of 26.00. The percentage of students who received 20 or fewer hours of tutoring was 28.79%. Almost 16% received 15 or fewer hours. Conversely, 53.20% of students received more than 25 hours of tutoring.

Participating students attended 116 schools within 23 unique school districts during the 2010-2011 academic year. Four school districts had students from more than 30% of their schools participating:

- Ault Highland RE9
- Denver County I

- Sheridan 2
- Westminster

However, only one school district had more than 10% of their student population participating in the SES program (Sheridan 2). Students from Denver County represented approximately 44% of the total number of students who received services.

SES VENDOR SERVICE PROVISION

Forty-five vendors provided SES services to the 7,986 participating students during the 2010-2011 academic year. While contracts must meet certain guidelines, the scope of each vendor's contract with the school district(s) it serves can vary widely. Across vendors the following factors may vary: cost per hour, number of students served, content area of tutoring, location of tutoring, and format of tutoring. During 2010 – 2011, vendor contracts with schools varied as follows:

- Number of students served: 3 to 740
- Approved hours of tutoring: 13 to 92 hours per student.
- Hourly cost: \$11.00 to \$97.00 per hour.
- Location: majority of students received tutoring at school (73.23%) or at home (20.48%) and
- Format: majority of students received tutoring in a group format.

SES VENDOR EFFECTIVENESS

NCLB requires CDE to evaluate the effectiveness of vendors and implement a procedure for removing vendors who are deemed ineffective for two consecutive years. Over the past several years, CDE developed a protocol for evaluating vendor effectiveness by comparing the achievement of students served by the vendor to a comparison group drawn from eligible students who did not participate in the SES program. The vendor effectiveness report provides details about each vendor's performance in relation to the comparison group that are utilized by CDE to make final decisions about vendor effectiveness. The selection of the comparison group and the analysis of data were completed by an impartial, external vendor: The Center for Research Strategies (CRS). Findings are detailed below.

READING ACHIEVEMENT

Grades K-3 (CBLA): Student improvement or achievement was measured by determining the percentage of students who were below the grade level target in the 2009 - 2010 academic year, but improved to at or above the grade level target in the 2010 - 2011 academic year.

In the comparison group, 18.78% of students improved from below to at or above grade level. Students receiving services from vendors performed as follows:

• Student improvement for individual vendors ranged from 2.38% to 26.45%.

- Student improvement exceeded the comparison group for students receiving services from 5 of the 18 evaluated vendors.

Grades 4-10 (CSAP): Student improvement or achievement was measured in two ways:

- The percentage of students who were below proficient on CSAP reading during the 2009 2010 academic year, but who improved at least one proficiency level during the 2010 2011 academic year.
- Median Growth Percentile: a measure of student improvement relative to other students with a similar achievement history.

A third index is also included, median z score, but this index is only taken into consideration as part of the body of evidence before a provider is removed from the State's list of approved providers.

Improvement in Proficiency Category: In the comparison group, 24.25% of students improved at least one proficiency category on CSAP reading. Students receiving services from vendors performed as follows:

- Student improvement for individual vendors ranged from 4.76% to 38.64%.
- Student improvement exceeded the comparison group for students receiving services from 7 of the 23 evaluated vendors.²

Median Growth Percentile: In the comparison group, median Growth Percentile was 47.00 for CSAP reading. Students receiving services from vendors performed as follows:

- Median growth percentiles of students in the vendor groups ranged from 32.00 to 74.00.
- Student improvement exceeded or equaled the comparison group for students receiving services from 17 of the 23 evaluated vendors.³

MATH ACHIEVEMENT

Grades 4-10 (CSAP): Student improvement or achievement was measured in two ways:

- The percentage of students who were below proficient on CSAP reading during the 2009 2010 academic year, but who improved at least one proficiency level during the 2010 2011 academic year.
- Median Growth Percentile: a measure of student improvement relative to other students with a similar achievement history.

A third index is also included, median z score, but this index is only taken into consideration as part of the body of evidence before a provider is removed from the State's list of approved providers.

Improvement in Proficiency Category: In the comparison group, 20.72% of students improved at least one proficiency category on CSAP math. Students receiving services from vendors performed as follows:

- Student improvement for individual vendors ranged from 13.48% to 33.33%.
- Student improvement exceeded the comparison group for students receiving services from 10 of the 14 evaluated vendors.⁴

Median Growth Percentile: In the comparison group, median Growth Percentile was 50.00 for CSAP math. Students receiving services from vendors performed as follows:

- Median growth percentiles of students in the vendor groups ranged from 34.50 to 65.00.
- Student improvement exceeded or equaled the comparison group for students receiving services from 11 of the 19 evaluated vendors.⁵

OVERALL PROGRAM EFFECTIVENESS

In order to improve the quality of the program, CDE also evaluates the extent to which the statewide program is effective at raising student performance and whether the benefits of the program vary as a function of student characteristics or services provided. CRS conducted the analyses on behalf of CDE to provide an impartial assessment of program effectiveness. Analyses were conducted separately for CBLA, CSAP Reading and CSAP math. Primary analyses compared the overall performance of students receiving tutoring services to the performance of the comparison group to assess program effectiveness.

CRS also created an independent index of vendor effectiveness. Vendors were rank ordered on each outcome measure for each assessment (e.g., CBLA, CSAP Reading) based upon their students' performance. From these rank orderings, vendors were classified as being in the top, middle or bottom tier of vendors providing services during the 2010 – 2011 academic year. This enabled an examination of whether statewide program effectiveness varied as a function of vendor effectiveness.

READING ACHIEVEMENT

Grades K-3 (CBLA): In general, students in the comparison group tended to demonstrate greater improvement in reading than students receiving SES services (18.78% vs. 14.99%). This finding was consistent across analyses. There were some indications that SES students who were fully English proficient (FEP) and those with an IEP may have improved more than comparison students. In addition students receiving online tutoring

tended to improve more than comparison students. However, none of these differences were statistically significant, probably due to small sample sizes.

Vendor effectiveness was associated with student improvement. Students of top tier vendors demonstrated greater improvement than students of bottom tier vendors and students of middle tier vendors were between the two. Students of bottom tier vendors demonstrated significantly less improvement than students in the comparison group.

Grades 4-10 (CSAP): Overall, students in the comparison group tended to demonstrate slightly better improvement in reading than students receiving SES tutoring. However, these differences were typically not significant. However, there were some notable findings.

- Students receiving **20** or more hours of tutoring improved significantly more (as measured by Median Growth Percentile) than students in the comparison group.
- Tutoring format had a significant impact on improvement (as measured by Median Growth Percentile). Students
 receiving online tutoring demonstrated significantly greater growth in reading performance than students in
 the comparison group.
- Vendor Effectiveness had a significant impact on improvement (as measured by Median Growth Percentile).
 - Students of top tier vendors demonstrated significantly better improvement than students in the comparison group.
 - Students of **bottom tier vendors** demonstrated significantly worse improvement than students in the comparison group.

MATH ACHIEVEMENT

Grades 4-10 (CSAP): Overall, students receiving SES tutoring demonstrated significantly greater improvement in math performance than students in the comparison group. This finding was consistent across outcome measures. Several notable findings should be highlighted.

- Students receiving 20 or more hours of tutoring improved significantly more than students in the comparison group.
- Students without an IEP demonstrated greater improvement than the comparison group. The same was not true for students with an IEP.
- While not statistically significant, students receiving **online tutoring** demonstrated the greatest improvement of all students. The small number of students receiving tutoring in this format likely impacted the analyses. All tutoring formats appeared effective for math.
- Vendor Effectiveness had a significant impact on improvement (as measured by Median Growth Percentile).
 - Students of **top tier vendors** demonstrated significantly better improvement than students in the comparison group.

EVALUATION OF NCLB TITLE I, PART A: SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

ACADEMIC YEAR 2010 – 2011 FINDINGS

Section I: Description of Supplemental Educational Services (SES) Program Participation

Section I of the SES report provides background information on the 7,986 students who received tutoring services under the program during the 2010 - 2011 academic year. Students participating in the programming were enrolled in Kindergarten through 10^{th} grade. The majority of students were Latino with slightly less than 34% of the participating students speaking English only.

Students participating in the program were enrolled in 116 schools within 23 districts in the state of Colorado. The 2010 – 2011 academic year was the first year of participation for almost 70% of students while the remainder participated in the program during prior years as well. The number of tutoring hours varied widely across students and ranged from 0.25 to 126 hours of tutoring during the academic year.

Figure 1-1. Number of Students Receiving SES Services during Single or Multiple by Years by Service Year¹⁰



Section 2: Description of Vendor Service Provision

Section 2 of the SES report describes the type, amount, and cost of tutoring services provided by vendors. During the 2010 - 2011 academic year, there were 45 state approved vendors that provided math or reading tutoring services to students through the SES program. Vendors served from 3 to 740 students throughout the academic year. Twenty-eight students received services from more than one vendor. Those students are represented in data for all vendors from which they received services resulting in a higher number of students served than reported in section 1 (7,986 + 28 = 8,014).

Vendors were approved to provide between 13 and 92 hours of tutoring per student. Less than 44% of students completed all of their approved contract hours. On average, students received 27.42 hours of tutoring across the academic year. The hourly cost of tutoring services varied widely across the vendors from a low of \$11.00 per hour to a high of \$97.00 per hour and an average cost of \$48.99 per hour. The average cost of tutoring per student for the year was \$1,224.31.

Vendors provided tutoring services in a variety of venues including students' homes, community centers, schools, and other sites. Vendors provided over 70% of tutoring services in school and 20% of tutoring services in students' homes. The majority of tutoring services were provided in a group format (72.09%), with some tutoring provided individually (17.54%) or online (6.95%).

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Section 3: SES Vendor Effectiveness

Section 3 of the SES report examines vendor effectiveness in impacting reading and math test scores. Effectiveness in improving reading achievement was examined separately for students in grades K-3 and those in grades 4-10 because different tests were utilized to assess performance. Vendor impact on math achievement was not assessed for grades K-3 because no assessment was available to assess performance.

In general, SES students were included in the effectiveness analyses if they:

- Had valid test scores for 2009 2010 and 2010 2011
- Completed the test in English (only relevant for reading) and
- Advanced a single grade between academic year 2009 2010 and 2010 2011.

Appendix C provides more detailed information on the data cleaning and comparison group selection process for Section 3 of the report. Efforts were taken to ensure that the comparison group was as comparable to the SES group as possible by only including students from schools that SES student attended, only including students eligible for free and reduced lunch, and taking prior proficiency level into consideration when drawing the comparison sample. Comparison samples were drawn independently for Reading K - 3, Reading 4 - 10, and Math 4 - 10.

Vendor effectiveness in improving student performance varied across subject area and criteria used to assess effectiveness.

- Reading grades K 3

APPENDIX C: DATA CLEANING AND ANALYSIS PROCEDURE

Data Cleaning and Analysis Procedure

REPORT SECTION I - DEMOGRAPHICS AND PROGRAM REACH

Vendor Session File Cleaning for Demographic Data

- Sessions coded as 'Absent' or 'Parent Contact Only' were removed.
- Records with session times of zero were removed (n = 74).
- Duplicate records of sessions of the same duration on the same date with the same student were removed (n = 26).
- Session times were checked, and 239 sessions had times between 4 and 6 hours. These were researched to ensure that data was not entered incorrectly. Corrections were made when necessary.
- Vendor session file considered "clean".

Program Reach Data

- The clean Vendor Session file (see above) was aggregated on student ID.
- There were 7,986 unique students in the file, including those with invalid student ID's. This file was used to generate the data for Tables I-4 and I-5. This file was also merged with historical SES session data files to generate the data for Figure I-I and Table I-3.

Demographic Data

- Students (n = 61) with invalid student ID's were removed.
 - The clean file with no invalid ID's was aggregated on student ID. There were 7,925 unique students with valid ID's who received SES services.
 - This file was merged with the CSAP and CBLA files to obtain the demographic data for the 7,925 unique students with valid student ID's who received SES services. This file was used to generate the data for Tables I-I and I-2.
 - Of the 7,925 students, 89 could not be matched to a test record in the CSAP or CBLA files.

REPORT SECTION 2 - DESCRIPTION OF VENDOR SERVICE PROVISION

Vendor Session File

- The clean Vendor Session file (see above) was aggregated on student ID and vendor.
- There were 8,014 unique student/vendor contracts with at least one session time greater than zero.
- Twenty-eight students had contracts with two vendors.
- This file was used to generate the data for Tables 2-1, 2-2, 2-3, 2-4, 2-5, and Appendix A, Table A-1. This file was also merged with the pre-/post-test vendor file to generate the data for Table 2-6. Thus, the 28 students with two contracts are represented twice in this section.

REPORT SECTION 3 – SES VENDOR EFFECTIVENESS

Vendor Session File

- The clean Vendor Session file with no invalid ID's (see above) was aggregated on student ID and vendor. There were 7,953 unique student/vendor contracts that had valid ID's and at least one session time greater than zero. Twenty-eight students with valid ID's had contracts with two vendors. The total number of unique contracts with valid ID's (7,953) is included in the counts of students served in Section 3 and Appendix B.
 - o If a student had multiple contracts for the same subject (math or reading), the contract with the greatest sum of service session times was retained for analysis, and the second contract was deleted. Thus, the students with multiple contracts for the same subject only counted once and only towards the vendor from which they received the greatest number of hours of tutoring time. If a student had two contracts, but at least one of the contracts was for one subject (i.e., math) exclusively, and the other contract was

- for the other subject (i.e., reading) exclusively or for both subjects (math and reading), then the first contract counted towards one test (i.e., CSAP Math), and the second contract counted for the second test (i.e., CSAP Reading).
- Sessions on or after cutoff dates and sessions with irrelevant tutoring subject matter were removed from each of three copies of the Vendor Session file.
 - For vendor sessions that were merged with the CSAP files, SES sessions on or after March 25, 2011, were removed because this was the middle of the CSAP testing window.
 - For vendor sessions that were merged with the CBLA file, SES sessions on or after April 25, 2011, were removed because this was the middle of the CBLA testing window.
 - For each test, students who did not receive the relevant type of tutoring were removed (i.e., students who only received math tutoring were not included in Reading CSAP or CBLA vendor effectiveness analyses even if they had a Reading CSAP or CBLA score).
- The resulting three versions of the Vendor Session file were ready to be merged with the test score files.
 - The SES Math file contained sessions prior to March 25, 2011 for math tutoring that were aggregated into unique student/vendor contracts that had been determined to count for Math vendor effectiveness.
 - The SES Reading file contained sessions prior to March 25, 2011 for reading tutoring that were aggregated into unique student/vendor contracts that had been determined to count for Reading vendor effectiveness.
 - The SES CBLA file contained sessions prior to April 25, 2011 for reading tutoring that were aggregated into unique student/vendor contracts that had been determined to count for Reading vendor effectiveness.

CBLA Files

- The DRA2 was selected as the test for analysis. All tests other than the DRA2 were removed from the 2010 and 2011 files.
- Invalid tests were removed (i.e., scores that were coded as missing) from the 2010 and 2011 files.
- The remaining students with duplicate records were removed (1,918 from 2010 and 338 from 2011).
- The 2011 and 2010 files were merged. Students who did not have both 2011 and 2010 scores were removed.
- The grade difference between the 2011 grade and 2010 grade was calculated. Students who did not have a difference of I (i.e., those who repeated or skipped grades) were removed.
- The file with all of the CBLA data was merged with the SES CBLA file. Students who were in the SES CBLA file
 but were not in the CBLA file were removed (i.e., those who did not have valid CBLA scores for 2010 and
 2011).
- There were 2,230 students in the CBLA SES sample.
- This file was used for all analyses of Reading Achievement for grades K-3 in Section 3 and Appendix B of the report.

Reading CSAP Files

- Invalid tests were removed (i.e., students who withdrew or did not complete the test) from the 2010 and 2011 files.
- Tests taken in Spanish were removed from the 2010 and 2011 files.
- The remaining students with duplicate records were removed (19 from 2011 and 0 from 2010).
- The 2011 and 2010 files were merged. Students who did not have both 2011 and 2010 scores were removed.

- Duplicates were removed from the 2011 CSAP Reading Growth file (38 students). Then the merged file with 2010 and 2011 CSAP Reading scores was merged with the 2011 CSAP Reading Growth file. Students who did not have 2011 and 2010 scores and a 2011 growth score were removed.
- The grade difference between the 2011 grade and 2010 grade was calculated. Students who did not have a difference of I (i.e., those who repeated or skipped grades) were removed.
- The file with all of the CSAP Reading data was merged with the SES Reading file. Students who were in the SES Reading file but were not in the CSAP Reading file were removed (i.e., those who did not have valid CSAP Reading scores for 2010 and 2011).
- There were 2,168 students in the Reading CSAP SES sample.
- This file was used for all analyses of Reading Achievement for grades 4-10 in Section 3 and Appendix B of the report.

Math CSAP Files

- Invalid tests were removed (i.e., students who withdrew or did not complete the test) from the 2010 and 2011 files.
- The remaining students with duplicate records were removed (21 from 2011 and 0 from 2010).
- The 2011 and 2010 files were merged. Students who did not have both 2011 and 2010 scores were removed.
- Duplicates were removed from the 2011 CSAP Math Growth file (37 students). Then the merged file with 2010 and 2011 CSAP Math scores was merged with the 2011 CSAP Math Growth file. Students who did not have 2011 and 2010 scores and a 2011 growth score were removed.
- The grade difference between the 2011 grade and 2010 grade was calculated. Students who did not have a difference of I (i.e., those who repeated or skipped grades) were removed.
- The file with all of the CSAP Math data was merged with the SES Math file. Students who were in the SES Math
 file but were not in the CSAP Math file were removed (i.e., those who did not have valid CSAP Math scores for
 2010 and 2011).
- There were 1,382 students in the Math CSAP SES sample.
- This file was used for all analyses of Math Achievement for grades 4-10 in Section 3 and Appendix B of the report.

Selecting Comparison Samples

- Each test file (CBLA, CSAP Reading, CSAP Math) containing the merged 2011 and 2010 scores (and Growth scores for CSAP) and SES records was split into SES students and non-SES students.
- For each test, the SES file was examined to determine the schools that the SES students had attended when they received SES services. Students who attended those schools were retained in the corresponding non-SES file for each test (students from all other schools were removed).
- For each test, students in the non-SES files who were not eligible for Free or Reduced Lunch were removed.
- The SES sample for each test was categorized by grade and proficiency level to determine the numbers in each group.
- For each test, the numbers in each grade/proficiency category of SES students were compared to the corresponding non-SES sample. The smallest ratio for each category (SES: non-SES) was applied to every grade/proficiency category for that test to determine the size of the comparison sample.
- The appropriate number of students (determined by the previous step) was randomly selected from each grade/proficiency category of non-SES students to create the comparison sample for each test.
