McKinney-Vento Education of Homeless Children and Youth Grant Program
The intent of the McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth
Program grant is to remove all educational barriers facing children and youth
experiencing homelessness, with an emphasis on educational enrollment,
attendance, and success. Requests for applications for this competitive grant
process will open on Tuesday, February 22, and close April 22, 2022.

Local Education Agencies (LEA) are eligible to apply for this opportunity. An eligible LEA is:

- A School District;
- A Board of Cooperative Services (BOCES);
- A Charter School authorized by a School District; or
- A Charter School authorized by the Charter School Institute.
